- 4. We became lobbyists. Over the course of a few years, we had over a hundred meetings with various politicians, ministry officials, local government representatives, journalists, etc.
- 5. The goal was to get the most important municipalities behind us to show that this was not just a wishful thinking of architects.
- 6. We explained to the municipalities what benefits they would get from the new position.
- 7. We held webinars for local governments and also visited them physically.
- B. We actively engaged with opposition politicians, because we have elections every few years and the probability that they will come to power soon is high. It paid off.



- 10. We organized election debates before both local and parliamentary elections. They were broadcast online by major media houses.
- 11. We wrote articles and organized conferences, and raised the issue at every conference where a representative of the Association of Architects was invited to speak.


